**2. Mitigation:** involves reducing the severity of emergencies, including measures like installing fire suppression systems to minimize damage and protect people and property.

**3. Preparedness:** is about planning for emergencies in advance. This includes developing emergency plans, conducting drills, ensuring availability of supplies, and assigning roles and responsibilities to employees.

**4. Response:** refers to immediate actions during an emergency, such as evacuation, medical aid, and activating emergency teams. Effective response relies on clear communication and coordinates efforts to protect lives and minimize losses.

**5. Recovery:** focuses on restoring normal operations after an emergency. This includes repairing infrastructure, supporting affected individuals, and reviewing the response to improve future preparedness and response efforts.
